



**I LICEUM OGÓLNOKSZTAŁCĄCE Z ODDZIAŁAMI DWUJĘZYCZNYMI  
IM. TOMASZA ZANA WE WSCHOWIE**

**Official report of the short - term learning/teaching/training activities  
of the Erasmus+ project Active Citizenship and Environmental Awareness  
Through Formal and Non-formal Education**

The Meeting of the Erasmus+ project „Active Citizenship and Environmental Awareness Through Formal and Non-formal Education” was held at I Liceum Ogólnokształcące z Oddziałami Dwujęzycznymi im. Tomasza Zana in Wschowa, Poland between 27th of February and 3rd of March, 2017.

Teachers and students from the partner school took part in this meeting:

- 3 teachers and 6 students from Lithuania,
- 1 teacher and 5 students from Romania,
- 2 teachers and 6 students from Czech Republic,
- 2 teachers and 4 students from Portugal,
- 2 teachers and 3 students from Italy,
- 2 students and 2 teachers from UK,
- 2 teachers and 3 students from Sweden.

The schedule of the official programme of the meeting, which is attached to this report, was followed. The week began on Monday 27th of February with the welcome conference which was

held at school. Teachers, students and journalists took part in this conference. All schools – partners were presented to the participants of the conference. Students and teachers from other countries presented themselves. Our students welcomed guests with songs and dances.

A short tour of the school followed this opening assembly so that our colleagues had an idea of life in our school.

During the five-day meeting the participants had an opportunity to see the beauty of our province since it had been decided that the region is especially worth visiting. Our partners admired the landmarks of Wschowa playing hare and hounds game, which was prepared by our students. Visiting Wschowa Public Library and the Water Tower, which was possible thanks to Spółka Komunalna in Wschowa, aroused the strongest emotions. Both the ju-jitsu and zumba displays appeared to be a nice surprise. While the students were enjoying the shows the teachers were taking part in a bilingual lesson as well as sharing their experience connected with teaching science.

On the second day of the meeting we went to Zielona Góra where both the students and teachers visited modern Centrum Przyrodnicze im. Jahannesa Keplera (Jahannes Kepler Science Centre) and watched the film entitled “Słońce, Ziemia, niebo” (“The Sun, The Earth, The Sky”) in Venus Planetarium. There are interactive stands, where one has to touch everything, connected with Physics, Biology, human evolution and the Earth. The visitors are supported and guided by the centre employees, who are experts in different fields. Zielona Góra Palm House seemed to be a highlight for many of our guests.

During the third day of the visit the teenagers took part in language workshops prepared by our English teachers. The students were working in international teams preparing ecological dictionaries. In the afternoon they participated in art classes called “Eco Fashion”. Undeniable, they proved themselves to be very imaginative creating original outfits from recycled materials. The youngest visitors (students from the primary school in Great Britain) had a chance to see an early childhood education and English lessons. The meeting of the project’s coordinators also took place on Wednesday. It was devoted to the visit in Italy in April 2017 and the second intellectual project.

The Chemistry show held by Mateusz Stocki, who works at the Faculty of Chemistry of Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań, evoked many positive emotions and responses. Thanks to him our school chambers transformed into a real chemist laboratory.

The last two days of the meeting were devoted to an eco-linguistic camp, which started with a trip around the area of Sława. With the help of Stowarzyszenie Wspierania Letniska Jodłów we managed to organize a hike to the end of the glacier in Puszcza Tarnawska. After that, the students learnt about observing the weather, which was by courtesy of Radzyń weather station staff. At the end, everyone could admire the beauty of Sławskie lake from an observation tower called "Joanna". The student and teachers spent the last evening of the meeting in the Słoneczko hotel in Sława playing educational and integrative games. Since it was the time full of laugh and fun everybody was sad to leave. During the farewell dinner, which the district governor Marek Boryczka and his deputy Wojciech Kuryłło took part in, the guest were given certificates and souvenirs from Starostwo Powiatowe in Wschowa, Urząd Miasta i Gminy Wschowa, "Lespin" company from Leszno and Stowarzyszenie Wspierania Letniska Jodłów.
