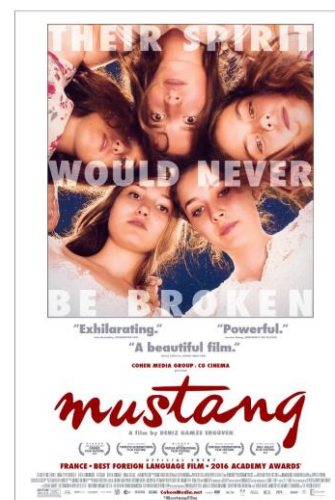
Sweden

30/5 : The students in Social Orientation in Year Two on the Natural Science Program created masks to exhibit in the Cube. The masks should symbolize freedom of religion.

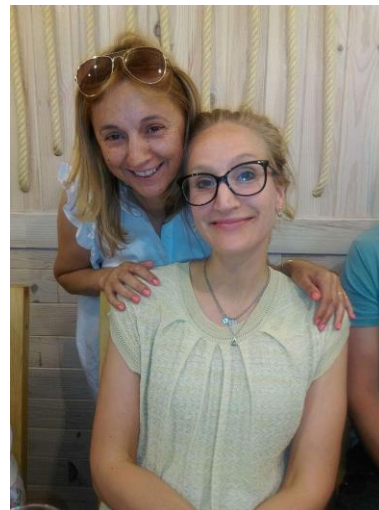

12/6 : Opening of our cube around human rights, the right to freedom in thought. Students have filled the cube with the work and thoughts about Article 18. The cube will be released in September when young people take over Stockholm and fill Kungsträdgården with creative interpretations of human rights. It is a cube for every human right based on the UN Declaration of Human Rights. The exhibition is opened by Jan Eliasson, former Deputy Secretary General of the United Nations. Unique for this year is that schools in Belgrade, Budapest, Paris and New York participate. Raoul Wallenberg Academy has distributed 30 human rights cubes in 30 schools. With the help of a large cube of steel and educational material, students have learned more about human rights and created the cubes with their creative interpretations of the human rights they were held responsible for.
